Recital Rules & Tips

Please do not take videos of the teacher, and only take videos of your own child.

Please hold applause until after each performer has finished all of their pieces.

You play, you stay! All performers must stay for the entire recital.

Performers who play from memory should put the piano's music stand down before they perform. The music stand blocks sound between the piano and performer, which tends to cause performers to play louder. Putting the music stand down allows the performer to hear the piano more similarly to how the audience hears it.

When bowing, smile and take your time. Look at the audience before and after the bow, and remember that bowing is a way to say "thank you for clapping" to the audience.

If the piano bench seems too low, too high, too far, or too close, take time to adjust it! The audience really doesn't mind waiting.

The biggest difference between the professional pianist and the amateur pianist is that the professional is better at ignoring his or her mistakes during a performance. Instead of worrying about getting every note perfect, focus instead on enjoying your own music and sharing your love for your pieces with the audience.
